### **Dr. Susan Michie**

**Dr. Susan Michie** is a Professor of Health Psychology and Director of the Centre for Behaviour Change at University College London, UK. Her research focuses on behaviour change in relation to health and how to translate evidence into practice. Topics include prevention, adjusting to illness, providers' behaviour, how to understand behaviour change theoretically, developing effective interventions. Dr. Michie is Associate Editor of *Annals of Behavioral Medicine* and of *Implementation Science*. She holds >25 research grants, has published >300 journal articles and recently the books 'The Behaviour Change Wheel Guide to Designing Interventions' and 'ABC of Behaviour Change Theories'.
