What is Knowledge Translation (KT)?

Knowledge translation (KT) is a bridge between research evidence and practice in an effort to strengthen health systems and improve health outcomes. But how do you apply this evidence?

At the KT Program, we believe that we can implement change in the health system by thinking about change differently. Our approach to KT is rooted in theory and science, but our application of KT is uniquely pragmatic and focused on real-world impact. Our training initiatives focus on empowering individuals and organizations in the health system with knowledge and support to do KT.

Our course offers:

- A learning environment to help you set and meet your individual KT learning goals.
- Interactive activities and assignments to help you develop your end of grant KT plan
- Review of your end of grant KT plan and personalized feedback by KT experts.
- An opportunity to connect with other professionals and share experiences, challenges, and successes.

Participants will learn how to:

- Develop an end of grant KT plan
- Assess impact of research – how to use and interpret bibliometrics and altmetrics
- Develop an approach to help tell your story using media and social media
