Relay the message! From Deliberative Dialogue to Knowledge Translation: An effective research tool

Learning objectives:

- Identify the 3 characteristics of a Deliberative Dialogues for Knowledge Translation

- Reflect on Deliberative Dialogue as an effective method for Knowledge Translation

Dr. Joyce Dogba is an assistant professor and researcher in the Department of Family and Emergency Medicine at Laval University's Faculty of Medicine. She co-leads the Patient Engagement group with Diabetes Action Canada SPOR Network and co-developed the patient engagement mechanism of the network through consultation with those whose lives are touched by diabetes. Her research agenda focuses on the evaluation of collaborative practices with patient-users in research and the education of health professionals. Dr. Dogba holds a degree in general medicine from Togo, and a PhD in Public Health at the University of Montreal. She completed post-doctoral fellowships at Shriners Hospital and McGill University.
