Building research partnerships to support child well-being in Nova Scotia

Learning objectives:

1. Define research partnerships through integrated knowledge translation and engaged scholarship approaches
2. Describe contextual factors that influence research partnerships
3. Identify ways to support research partnerships

Dr. Jessie-Lee Mclsaac is an Assistant Professor and Tier II Canada Research Chair in Early Childhood: Diversity and Transitions with the Faculty of Education and Department of Child and Youth Study at Mount Saint Vincent University. Mclsaac uses an engaged scholarship approach— working with community, policy makers and engaging family participants— to co-produce research that mobilizes knowledge and experiences *for* and *with* marginalised families to inform policy and practice. Mclsaac completed a post-doctoral fellowship funded by KT Canada and the Canadian Cancer Society that included an embedded placement within the provincial government focused on knowledge mobilization within school policy interventions.
